July 21, 1861 - Union forces wanted to attack smaller Confederate force at Bull Run (in hopes to capture capital, Richmond) Yanks attacked, but Stonewall Jackson's forces held out - Union fled. Southern victory was bad for them because it caused overconfidence, many deserted thinking war was over.
