It should be noted, however, that Derrida understands the experience of coming to be in agreement as one in which "one has been perfectly understood" (Dialogue and Deconstruction, 54 emphasis added). It is clear that Gadamer, recognizing the finitude of human being, argues only for a partial understanding of the other in coming to be in agreement.

After its initial task of "deconstruction," hermeneutic Destruktion, as Gadamer describes it, has the further task of reviving the issues raised by the text in such a way as to render the text a partner in discussion. It is this dialogue with the text that, according to Gadamer, Derrida's deconstruction disallows.

Deconstruction, Destruktion, and Dialogue

The Gadamer-Derrida debate concerns the issue of the containment of otherness in Gadamer's hermeneutics and it began with an encounter between Hans-Georg Gadamer and Jacques Derrida in April 1981 in a Sorbonne conference in Paris on "Text and Interpretation". Before this debate, there had not been any confrontation or dialogue between hermeneutics in Germany and post-structuralism in France.

DECONSTRUCTION AND/OR HERMENEUTICS: PLACING JACQUES ...

revolving around the 1981 "Gadamer-Derrida Encounter" (Palmer & Michelfelder 1989), have established the differences between deconstruction and hermeneutics, the former being seen as pursuing a decentering, separatist, function, while the latter is working towards dialogue, conversation, and reconciliation.
