When shared decision-making is appropriate. Shared decision-making can be used in most clinical settings, although it may not be appropriate in emergency care, where quick decisions must be made and there is usually little time for deliberation. Box 2 describes the impact of using a decision aid in patients experiencing leg cramps taking quinine.
